God is Still with Us

Last summer, guided by a consultant from the New England Synod, Immanuel entered a "transition process" which we expected to carry us into a bright future. We recently received a letter from the synod summarizing their observations from the process. It was not what we had hoped for. Here are some of my observations and comments:

We have a lot of strong feelings now. Disappointment. Anger. Grief. Hope. Despair. Sadness. We need to acknowledge them and express them. Most of all we are sad. We are sad our children, grandchildren, and friends are no longer active in the church. We are sad our community is not as supportive as it once was. While we grieve for the church we once had, and in all likelihood will never have again, we need not direct those feelings inappropriately or disproportionately. We can have strong feelings, but we don't have to let them have us.

We are still here. We still gather for worship. We just distributed food to people who needed our help for Thanksgiving. We continue to share our building with nine other groups on a regular basis. We still gather for fellowship and to support each other. We are not planning to close or planning to plan to close.

We are still gathered in Christ's name. We are still called by Christ to worship God and serve God's people. (The Biblical word for "church" means those who are assembled, those who are called.) We are still responding to Christ's call and we will continue to respond as we are able.

We are called by Christ to be his Church in Meriden in 2023. We are not called to be a megachurch in Florida. We are not called to be the church of the 1950's or 1960's or whenever things were whatever they were as we remember them in our "golden age". We are called to be here now, even though that means being called to a world that is troubled, hard to be in, and difficult to serve. We are called.

Read your Bibles. A huge portion of the Biblical story is about troubled times. Slavery in Egypt. (Then God led them out of Egypt and into the promised land.) Exile in Babylon. (Then God had Cyrus send them back home.) Roman occupation in Palestine. (Then God morphed the Roman Empire into Christendom.) Family betrayals. Bad kings. Disciples who panicked and abandoned Jesus on the cross. (And three days later resurrection.) God called God's people, had a plan, and provided.

We too are called by a God who is with us and has a plan for us. God will always be with us. (Remember "Immanuel" means – "God with us".) And God will continue to provide for us and guide us into the future.

Hang in there. Acknowledge and process your feelings, especially your sadness and your grief. Remember while God's plans are usually longer term than ours, God always includes us in those plans.

The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. (Psalm 46.7 NRSV)

Finance Committee News

We are grateful for everyone who has made donations to the Contingency Fund. Through October 31st we have received \$6,535 in donations to offset the \$13,359 deficit in the 2023 budget. That's approximately \$816.00 a month since we started the campaign. With that monthly average we should expect to reach \$8,200 by year's end. As we acknowledge that all of our wealth comes from the Lord; Can we do better? There are many ways to donate for those giving online, the online giving portal includes the Contingency Fund as a selection. For those giving with weekly envelopes, every month there is an envelope dedicated to a miscellaneous offering; those envelopes can be used to direct funds to the Contingency Fund. We also have dedicated envelopes in the Sanctuary and in Augustana Hall. There is also a Pasta Dinner fundraiser scheduled for Dec. 9th beginning at 4:30.

2024 offering envelopes will be available beginning Dec 10, 2023.

The Audit Committee completed and the Council approved the mid-year 2023 audit. A copy is available in the church office.



Box Top Labels

Thank you to the congregation and friends for participating in the Box Tops for Education program. This is a project that my mother, Ruth Tozier, started many years ago. A collection box is attached to the bulletin board, outside Augustana Hall. Please continue to save your grocery receipts for this worthy cause. Once the receipts are scanned credit is given to the Navajo Lutheran Mission in Arizona.





Eventually the Box Tops program will become digital-only.

Participating brands are starting to change their packaging from a traditional Box Tops clip to the new Box Tops label.

If you see this label, use the new Box Tops app to scan your receipt.

Box Tops are still worth 10¢ for your school. The app will find participating products purchased at any store and instantly add cash to your school's earnings online.



The grocery receipt needs to be scanned within 2 weeks of purchasing. This box top is useless without the receipt. Thank you for saving your grocery receipts.

If you download the app, the zip code for the Navajo School is 86545. If you do not want to or know how to download the app, you can place your receipt in the collection box and I will upload the receipt. Just a reminder, if you are collecting this box top label, please supply your grocery receipt for scanning.
