Lenten Covenants - The Promises of God to Provide for God's People

During Lent this year we meet Tuesday nights for Dinner Church, a potluck meal followed by Holden Evening Prayer worship. The scriptures for worship are Old Testament lessons from the previous Sundays and are about the covenants God made with God's people. (See elsewhere in this month's Visitor for the schedule for Dinner Church this Lent.)

"Covenant" is a blend of agreement, contract, and promise God makes with God's people to make God's own and provide for them.

Here are the Covenants we are looking at this year at Dinner Church, starting a couple weeks back in February when Lent began this year:

- Tue Feb 20 Genesis 9.8-17 The Rainbow as God's promise never to destroy the earth again by flood.
- Tue Feb 27 Genesis 17:1-16 God promises to give Abraham and Sarah children in spite of their old age and make a great people through them.
- Tue Mar 5 Ex 20.1-17 The Law as God's way of showing God's people how to live and not sin.
- Tue Mar 12 Numbers 21.4-9 The Bronze Serpent as a way God provides to heal the people.
- Tue Mar 19 Jeremiah 31.31-34 The Covenant in Our Hearts, as God's promise to make people god's own without having to teach them the whole law. (As Christians we might call think of this as the Holy Spirit we receive in baptism.)

While we won't have Dinner Church during Holy Week (Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services instead), the Old Testament lessons for Palm Sunday and Easter continue the themes of God's provision for God's people:

- Sun Mar 24 Isaiah 50.4-9a (Palm Sunday) God helps God's people and takes away their shame.
- Tue Mar 31 Isaiah 25.6-9 (Easter Sunday) God swallows up death forever and provides a feast for all people.

As you hear these lessons at Dinner Church or in worship Sunday morning or read them at home, consider how has God made you God's own in these promises. How has God provided for youand saved you? How can you live your life out of gratitude for these gifts?

March Fundraiser: A Matching Challenge

Immanuel's Council Committee has pledged to **match** up to a maximum of \$600 in March contingency giving. This will be a total **match** not individual. Finance News

At the Annual Meeting on January 21st, the congregation approved a 2024 budget that included a \$5,259 deficit. This deficit figure is much lower than we faced in 2023 so we are confident we can obtain this funding goal. With a deficit budget we must present a plan to make up the amount of the deficit. Our plan this year will be just like last year. We will have an annual appeal to drive extra giving to the Contingency fund so we can easily track our progress and report that progress to the congregation, via the visitor, emails, and our deficit progress graph at Immanuel.

There are many ways to donate. The online giving portal includes the Contingency Fund as a selection, for those with weekly envelopes, each month there is an envelope dedicated to miscellaneous offerings, those envelopes can be used to direct funds to the Contingency Fund. We also have dedicated envelopes in the pew racks in the Sanctuary and in Augustana Hall. There will also be a few fundraisers and challenges planned in the coming months. Based on the calendar year our goal is about \$440.00 per month in contingency donations.

Audit Committee

The audit committee is in need of two volunteers to serve on the Audit Committee for the Year End (2023) Audit and the mid-year 2024 audit. The records for the 2023 end of year audit are ready now, midyear takes place usually in August. The Audit committee meets two times a year to audit Immanuel's books. You do not need accounting experience to participate. If you are interested or know someone who might be interested, please reach out to any member of the Finance Committee.

Box Top Labels

Thank you to the congregation and friends for participating in the Box Tops for Education program. This is a project that my mother, Ruth Tozier, started many years ago. A collection box is attached to the bulletin board, outside Augustana Hall. Please continue to save your grocery receipts for this worthy cause. Once the receipts are scanned credit is given to the Navajo Lutheran Mission in Arizona.





Eventually the Box Tops program will become digital-only.

Participating brands are starting to change their packaging from a traditional Box Tops clip to the new Box Tops label.

If you see this label, use the new Box Tops app to scan your receipt.

Box Tops are still worth 10¢ for your school. The app will find participating products purchased at any store and instantly add cash to your school's earnings online.



The grocery receipt needs to be scanned within 2 weeks of purchasing. This box top is useless without the receipt. Thank you for saving your grocery receipts.

If you download the app, the zip code for the Navajo School is 86545. If you do not want to or know how to download the app, you can place your receipt in the collection box and I will upload the receipt. Just a reminder, if you are collecting this box top label, please supply your grocery receipt for scanning.
